## 2018 SCHEDULE NOTES



The Steelers have played two of their five scheduled nationally televised primetime games, including one of two at Heinz Field, during the 2018 season.

Pittsburgh's first home nationally televised primetime game occurred in Week Four, when it hosted the Baltimore Ravens on Sunday Night Football (NBC.). The team's next home primetime game comes in Week 10 when it hosts the Carolina Panthers on Thursday Night Football (FOX/NFLN 8:20).

The Steelers have appeared in one of their three other primetime road matchups in 2018, defeating the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Monday Night Football in Week Three. Pittsburgh heads to Jacksonville in Week 11 (Nov. 18) to face the Jaguars on Sunday Night Football (NBC, 8:20 p.m.) and caps off its regular season primetime schedule in Week 14 (Dec.) with a Sunday Night Football game at the Oakland Raiders (NBC, 8:20 p.m.).

The Steelers' bye week will be on Oct. 21 (Week Seven).

## STEELERS 2018 DRAFT CLASS

### S Terrell Edmunds (6-1, 217)

Rd. 1 28th Overall

Played collegiate football at Virginia Tech where he appeared in 37 games, making 31 starts...he totaled 182 tackles, including 6.5 tackles for losses...Edmunds started all 10 games en route to recording 59 tackles during the 2017 season.

### WR James Washington (5-11, 213)

Rd. 2 60th Overall

Set an Oklahoma State University school record with 4,472 career receiving yards, also the second-best receiving yardage total in Big 12 conference history...he became one of two players in school history with three seasons of at least 1,000 receiving yards and three years with at least 10 touchdown catches.

### QB Mason Rudolph (6-5, 235)

Rd. 3 76th Overall

Led Oklahoma State University to a 32-9 record as the quarterback to produce the winningest record by a signal caller in school history...he finished his career holding no fewer than 54 school records, including single-season and career marks for passing yards, passing touchdowns and pass efficiency...his 13,618 career passing yards rank him fourth in Big 12 conference history.

### OL Chukwuma Okorafor (6-8, 320)

Rd. 3 92nd Overall

At Western Michigan University, started each of his final 39 games... he was a first-team All-American selection following the 2017 campaign by the Football Writers Association of America.

### S Marcus Allen (6-2, 215)

Rd. 5 148th Overall

Became the sixth player in Penn State football history to reach the 300-tackle mark in a career...his 321 stops rank fifth in program history... he was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2017, starting 13 games and recording 72 tackles (46 solo).

### RB Jaylen Samuels (6-0, 225)

Rd. 5 165th Overall

Established a North Carolina State University school record for receptions in a career, finishing with 202...his 47 total touchdowns place him second in program annals and he finished fourth in touchdown receptions (19) and sixth in touchdown runs (28).

The 2018 Steelers Hall of Honor Induction ceremony took place on Friday, Sept. 28, at Heinz Field. Each inductee received a replica of a solid steel football, which replicates the original that was given to Steelers' founder Arthur J. Rooney Sr. by the United States Steel Corporation and United Steel Workers in 1982 on the occasion of the team's 50th Season.

The Steelers' Hall of Honor, established with its inaugural class of 27 members in 2017, is comprised of former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise's success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933.

The Hall of Honor Selection Committee consists of Steelers President Art Rooney II, Joe Gordon, Bob Labriola, Stan Savran, Andrew Stockey, and Tony Quatrini.

**TE Vance McDonald** set a single-game career high and recorded the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career with 112 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown catch on Monday Night Football in Week Three.

The number of games in which **WR Antonio Brown** played to record career catch No. 750, in Week Two vs. Kansas City, setting an NFL record for the fewest games to the milestone (Marvin Harrison: 121).

**RB James Conner** rushed for 135 yards in his first career NFL start in Week One - the first 100-rushing yard game of his career and added two rushing touchdowns and finished with 192 yards from scrimmage.

**138**

**TE Jesse James** produced the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career with 138 yards in Week Two vs. Kansas City. His 138 yards are the second-most by a Steelers tight end since 1960 (158, Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991).

**204**

The number of regular season games **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has played in, all with Pittsburgh, breaking a tie with Donnie Shell for sole possession of the third-most games played in team history.

**452**

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** passed for 452 yards in Week Two vs. Kansas City - the fifth 450-yard game of his NFL career, breaking a tie with Dan Marino for the most in NFL history.

**10,000**

**WR Antonio Brown** reached the 10,000-receiving yard milestone in the 116th regular-season game of his NFL career in Week One - tying Torry Holt for the second-fewest games in NFL history to the mark.

**12-13-2015**

**LB Bud Dupree** recoded a interception return for a touchdown in Week Three at Tampa Bay - the team's first pick-six since Dec. 13, 2015 at Cincinnati (William Gay).



### **THE STEELERS**

- Pittsburgh is now 27-21 on Sunday Night Football (13-8 at home).
- Pittsburgh is now 25-8 at Heinz Field in primetime games since the stadium opened in 2001, and 10-7 on Sunday Night Football at Heinz Field.
- The Steelers are now 24-21 in regular-season series history against the Ravens (14-9 at home) and 11-7 at Heinz Field.
- Pittsburgh is now 8-8 in primetime games against Baltimore during the regular season, including 6-4 at home.
- Pittsburgh is now 5-5 in regular-season games against Baltimore in the month of September (3-2 at home in the month).
- The Steelers are 458-287-3 during the regular season since 1970.
- Pittsburgh improved to 2-of-2 on two-point conversions in 2018, with a QB Ben Roethlisberger to RB James Conner connection in the second quarter.

### **HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN**

- His regular-season record is now 117-62-1 since becoming the Steelers' head coach in 2007 (65-25 at home).
- Is now 11-12 as Pittsburgh's head coach in regular-season games vs. Baltimore (7-5 at home).
- Owns a 47-20-1 regular-season record in games vs. AFC North opponents (26-8 at home).
- Is now 22-18-1 in regular-season games during the month of September (12-5 at home).
- Claims a 37-17 mark in regular-season primetime games, including 17-9 on Sunday Night Football.

### **WR JUJU SMITH-SCHUSTER**

- Caught four passes for 60 yards, including a long reception of 38 yards.

### **WR RYAN SWITZER**

- Led all players with a single-game career high for receptions (seven) and matched a single-game personal best of 32 receiving yards (Dec. 31, 2017 at Philadelphia).

### **TE VANCE MCDONALD**

- Set a single-game career best for receptions in the first half of a game with five, and tied for the team lead in receiving yards for the game (62).

### **QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER**

- Made his 100th career regular-season home start, completing 27-of-47 passes for 274 yards with one touchdown and an interception.
- Is now 136-65-1 as a starter during the regular season (74-26 at home). His 74 wins in his first 100 home games starts are tied as the fourth-most in NFL history (Brady: 87, Brett Favre: 82, John Elway: 77, Peyton Manning: 74).
- Owns a 40-15 record in regular-season primetime games as a starter in his NFL career (21-4 at home).
- Is now 18-7 on Sunday Night Football as a starter in the regular season (9-4 at home).
- His regular-season record is now 12-9 against Baltimore as a starter (9-3 at home).
- Increased his Steelers records for pass completions to 4,283, passing yards to 52,479 and touchdown passes 337.
- Has completed 25 passes or more in three consecutive games for the third time in his NFL career (Oct. 26-Nov. 9, 2014 and Nov. 30-Dec. 14, 2014).

### **WR ANTONIO BROWN**

- Tied for the team lead with 62 receiving yards on five catches, including a 26-yard touchdown grab from QB Ben Roethlisberger.
- Has registered at least one reception in 127 consecutive games in which he has played, including the postseason – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Has registered at least one reception in 117 consecutive regular-season games – dating back to October 3, 2010.

- Increased his career field goals made with the Steelers to 88 – the sixth-most in team history.

**P JORDAN BERRY**

- Landed one punt inside the Ravens' 20, breaking a tie with Mark Royals (85) for sole possession of the third-most punts inside the 20 in Steelers history.

The Steelers selected four players to serve as team captains for the 2018 season, the team announced through a vote of their teammates.

Quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** and center **Maurkice Pouncey** will serve as the offensive captains, defensive tackle **Cameron Heyward** will serve as the defensive captain and kicker **Chris Boswell** will serve as the special teams captain.

Roethlisberger has been selected as an offensive captain for the 10th time in his career (2008, '09, '11, '12, '13, '14, '15, '16, '17 and '18). This marks Heyward's fourth consecutive year as a captain (2015-18), and the second time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 18). Boswell has been named a captain for the first time in his career.

Sunday's game will be the eighth time the two teams will meet in Pittsburgh, where the Steelers have won or tied each of the seven meetings...the two teams have met seven times in the month of October during the regular season, with the Steelers holding a 6-1 advantage in the month vs. the Falcons, including a 4-0 mark at home in October.

**ATLANTA** – CB William Gay's 52-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter gave the Steelers a 13-0 lead and the team held off the Falcons' late rally for a 27-20 victory at the Georgia Dome.

K Shaun Suisham made two first quarter field goals, both from 38 yards out, to give the Steelers a 6-0 lead at the end of the first period. On Atlanta's first drive of the second quarter, Gay picked off QB Matt Ryan and returned it 52 yards for a score. It marked Gay's third pick-six this season, a new team record for most interceptions returned for a touchdown in a single season.

Late in the second quarter, Ryan connected with WR Devin Hester on a 17-yard touchdown to cut the Steelers lead 13-7. With less than 30 seconds remaining in the half, RB Le'Veon Bell scored on a one-yard run to give Pittsburgh a 20-7 advantage at halftime. Atlanta managed two field goals by K Matt Bryant (28, 22) in the third quarter to cut Pittsburgh's lead 20-13 heading into the final quarter.

Only one minute into the fourth quarter, Bell scored from 13 yards out to give the Steelers a 27-13 advantage. Ryan threw a four-yard pass to WR Roddy White on the Falcons ensuing drive to give Atlanta its final points of the contest.

The Falcons had multiple opportunities to stop Pittsburgh but the Steelers kept getting key first downs, none bigger than a third-and-one conversion from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** to TE Heath Miller. The two connected on a 25-yard pass and Pittsburgh ran out the clock for the win.

## PRIMETIME SPECIALIST

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 35 primetime games, including a 30-27 win on Monday Night Football in Week Three of the 2018 season at Tampa Bay.

Mike Tomlin, the 12th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 37-17 overall record in regular-season primetime games.

He is 13-2 on Monday Night Football, 17-9 on Sunday Night Football and 7-6 on Thursday Night Football.

## TOMLIN VS. NFC

During his career, **Mike Tomlin's** regular-season record against the NFC is 30-15, including 17-5 at home.

Tomlin earned his 50th regular season home win in Week Nine in 2015 vs. Oakland and joined Chuck Noll (119) and Bill Cowher (85) as the third head coach in Steelers history with 50 regular season home victories.

Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first 11 seasons - through 2017 - as the team's head coach and six home wins in eight of his 11 at the helm through 2017.

## 12-PLUS IN

**Mike Tomlin** produced a career-best 13 wins in 2017 with the Steelers - his fourth season as the team's head coach with at least 12 regular-season wins since becoming the team's head coach in 2007.

Since 2007, Pittsburgh's four seasons with at least 12 regular-season wins are tied with the Denver Broncos for the second-most 12-win seasons in the NFL (New England: 9).

In his first 11 seasons as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

His 116 wins in his first 11 seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach in his first 11 campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances are second-most for the franchise for a coach in his first 11 seasons.

Tomlin's eight postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first 11 seasons with the Steelers and his six division titles are third-most.

## TOMLIN'S 100TH IN 10

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season:

- He is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **RB James Conner** on a two-point attempt in Week Two vs. Kansas City and in Week Four vs. Baltimore in 2018.

Pittsburgh converted two of its four two-point attempts in 2017, and three of its nine tries in 2016, their first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).

The Steelers converted 8-of-11 two-point attempts in 2015 - setting a new NFL record for the most conversions in a season.

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** opened the 2018 season with three consecutive 300-passing yard games for the first time in his NFL career. He threw for 335 yards in Week One at Cleveland. In Week Two vs. Kansas City, Roethlisberger threw for 452 yards with three touchdowns for a passer rating of 104.3 - breaking a tie with Dan Marino for the most 450-passing yard games in NFL history with five - and surpassing John Elway for the seventh-most passing yards in League history. On Monday Night Football in Week Three, Roethlisberger threw for 353 yards on 30-of-38 passing with three touchdowns and one interception for a 120.7 passer rating.

Roethlisberger earned 117 wins in his first 175 regular-season starts - the second-most by an NFL QB in League history through 175 starts (Tom Brady: 136).

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90<sup>th</sup> career win in his 135<sup>th</sup> career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

He earned his 130th win as a starting quarterback in his 192nd start in Week 10 of 2017 at Indianapolis to mark the third-fewest starts in NFL history to win 130 games (Tom Brady: 168 and Peyton Manning: 189).

## THE 45 AND 50,000 CLUB

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** became the eighth quarterback in NFL history - first in team history - to reach 50,000 passing yards in regular-season career games - a feat he accomplished in Week 13 of 2017 at Cincinnati. He reached 50,000 passing yards in his 197th regular-season game to become the fifth quarterback in NFL history to reach the milestone in fewer than 200 games.

Roethlisberger became the first player in Steelers history to register 45,000 career passing yards in Week 10's game vs. Dallas. He was the 11th quarterback in NFL history to reach the mark, the eighth to do so with one team, and the fourth active signal caller with 45,000 passing yards.

## BEN GOING OVER 90

**WR Antonio Brown** reached the 7,500 scrimmage yard milestone in Week Three's game at Philadelphia in 2016. He accomplished the feat in his 89th career regular-season game to tie Calvin Johnson for the fourth-fewest games to 7,500 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

Brown reached the 8,000 scrimmage yard mark in Week 10's game vs. Dallas in 2016, in his 95th career regular-season game to mark the sixth-fewest games to 8,000 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

In Week Five vs. Jacksonville, Brown totaled 10 catches for 157 receiving yards to eclipse the 9,000 scrimmage yard barrier. He reached 9,000 career scrimmage yards in 106 regular-season games - marking the third-fewest games to the milestone in Steelers history (Jerome Bettis: 101 and Franco Harris: 104) and tied Randy Moss for the fifth-fewest games to the milestone by a wide receiver in NFL history.

Smith-Schuster ended his regular-season rookie year becoming the first rookie in Steelers history to record a kickoff return for a touchdown (96 yards) and a touchdown catch (20 yards) in the same game in Week 17 vs. Cleveland. His 265 combined yards (143 receiving + 122 kickoff return) were the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (273, Charles Johnson, Dec. 24, 1994 at San Diego).

He totaled a single-game career highs in receiving yards (193), including a 97-yard touchdown catch-and-run from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the team's Week Eight 20-15 win at Detroit. The 97-yard connection is the longest pass play in team history and ties as the longest offensive play in franchise annals. His 193 receiving yards marked the second-most by a Steelers rookie in a single-game, behind Jimmy Orr's 205 on Dec. 13, 1958.

In Week 15 vs. New England, the rookie wide receiver posted the second 100-yard game of 2017, leading the team with 114 yards on a team-best six catches. His 69-yard catch-and-run is the second longest reception of his NFL career.

His five touchdown catches are the most in NFL history by a player before his 21st birthday (turned 21 on Nov. 22).

## CONNER GOES OVER 100

**RB James Conner** made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), touchdowns (2 rushing), receptions (5), receiving yards (57) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland.

His 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-rushing yard game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards are the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.

The second-year running back totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing touchdown and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a one-yard run, in Week Two against Kansas City.

## THE OUTLAW JESSE JAMES

**TE Jesse James** produced a single-game career high and led all receivers with 138 receiving yards on five receptions and a touchdown in Week Two's game against Kansas City. His 138 receiving yards marked the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career, and the second-most by a Steelers tight end since 1960 (158, Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991 vs. Philadelphia).

## MCDONALD CAREER GAME

**TE Vance McDonald** set a single-game career high and registered the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL regular season career with 112 receiving yards on four catches in Week Three of 2018 at Tampa Bay on Monday Night Football. He became the second Steelers tight end since 1960, to record at least 100 receiving yards in the first half of a game (Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991, 118 yards). ## WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

**LB Vince Williams** led all players with 12 tackles (4 solo), including a tackle for a loss in Week One of 2018 at Cleveland. His 12 tackles marked the second double-digit tackle game of his NFL career (15, Oct. 2, 2016 vs. Kansas City).

In 2017, Williams set a single-season career high and finished second on the team with 8.0 sacks during the 2017 regular season, surpassing his previous mark of 2.0 in 2016, and ranked third on the team's defense with a single-season career best 88 tackles (68 solo).

He posted his first career multi-sack game, finishing with 2.0 against the Chiefs in Week Six.

The Florida State product sacked Indianapolis QB Jacoby Brissett in Week 10 for a loss of four yards in the fourth quarter.

Williams brought down Tennessee QB Marcus Mariota for a nine-yard loss in Week 11, increasing his 2017 sack total to 6.0. He finished the game with 7 tackles (6 solo), three quarterback hits, 2 tackles for losses and 1.0 sack.

Williams started each of the team's 16 regular season games in 2017, and established a single-season career high 88 tackles (68 solo), along with a career-best 14 quarterback hits and adding 11 tackles for losses.

## DAVIS IN YEAR TWO

**S Sean Davis** started each of the Steelers' 16 regular-season games in 2017, and finished with a team-best and career high 90 tackles (69 solo), along with a career bests in interceptions (3), passes defended (8) and tackles for losses (7), to go along with 1.0 sack, two quarterback hits and a defensive forced fumble.

Davis recorded at least 8 total tackles in four games, including the first double-digit tackle games of his NFL career with 10 vs. New England in Week 15 and a career high 12 vs. Baltimore in Week 14.

In the Week 17 regular season finale vs. Cleveland, the team's 2016 second-round Draft selection posted his sole sack of the season, and hauled in his third interception of the year.

## HILTON MAKING AN IMPACT

**CB Mike Hilton** picked off Tampa Bay QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the second quarter of a Week Three Monday Night Football game at Tampa Bay at the Pittsburgh's six-yard line – his first interception of 2018 – and the third of his NFL career. He also recovered a fumble in the second quarter, forced by CB Artie Burns on Tampa Bay WR Chris Godwin, marking the first defensive fumble recovery of his NFL career.

Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defended.

Hilton set a single-game career high with 3.0 sacks and added 6 tackles (all solo) in Week 16 at Houston. He became the third Steelers defensive back with 3.0 sacks in a game since the statistic became official in 1982, joining Troy Polamalu (Sept. 18, 2005 at Houston) and Carnell Lake (Nov. 30, 1997 at Arizona). He tallied the first sack and interception of his NFL career in the Steelers' 26-9 win at Baltimore in Week Four. His sack, a six-yard takedown of Baltimore QB Joe Flacco came in the third quarter, and his interception off of Flacco in the fourth quarter.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, Hilton picked off QB Marcus Mariota on the Titans' first offensive possession of the game - marking the Steelers' first of four interceptions in the team's 40-17 win.



## HADEN BREAKING IT UP



**CB Joe Haden**, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend of 2017 at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half – his first sack with the Steelers – third of his NFL career – and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland). In Week Seven vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.

Since entering the NFL in 2010, Haden has recorded 113 passes defended - the second-most among all NFL defenders:

The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 94-of-103 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 395 tackles (321 solo), 20 interceptions, 112 passes defended, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

## BURNETT AND BOSTIC ON THE D

**S Morgan Burnett** and **LB Jon Bostic** joined the Steelers as free agent signings during the 2018 offseason.

Burnett spent his first eight seasons in the NFL with the Green Bay Packers. The Georgia Tech product was a third-round (71st overall) draft selection of the Packers in 2010. He started all 102 regular season games played for Green Bay as well as 11 postseason contests. His career numbers include 683 tackles (485 solo), 44 passes defended, nine interceptions, eight forced fumbles and 7.5 sacks.

Bostic joined the Steelers after spending the 2017 season with the Indianapolis Colts, where he recorded 97 tackles and 1 sack. Previously, Bostic played for the New England Patriots (2016), and the Chicago Bears (2013-15). He was a second-round (50th overall) draft selection of Chicago in 2013 out of Florida.

## WATT DOMINATES WEEK ONE

**LB T.J. Watt** finished Week One's game in Cleveland with 10 tackles (7 solo), 3.0 sacks (minus 16 yards) and a blocked field goal. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for Week One, becoming the first Steelers linebacker since 2010 (Lawrence Timmons, Week Six).

## WATT IN 2017 ROOKIE YEAR

**LB T.J. Watt** - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - recorded 52 tackles (39 solo), 7.0 sacks, 10 tackles for losses, 12 quarterback hits, eight passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble and blocked a field goal attempt in 15 games played, all starts, in his 2017 rookie season.

Watt's 7.0 sacks topped the 2017 NFL rookie linebacker class - tied for second among all NFL rookies - and are the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (Kendrell Bell, 2001: 9.0):

Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982. He finished Week 1's 21-18 win at Cleveland with 6 tackles (5 solo), 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception.

With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became:

- Third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

## 50-5-5-1 - ONLY ONE

**LB T.J. Watt** was the only NFL linebacker to have finished the 2017 regular season with at least 50 tackles (52), 5.0 sacks (7.0), 5 passes defended (8) and one interception (1).

The Steelers opened up the scoreboard with a 71-yard touchdown pass from Steelers **QB Landy Jones** to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster**.

Philadelphia pulled ahead by one point after QB Nate Sudfeld found TE Dallas Goedert in the end zone for a 15-yard touchdown, followed by a successful two-point conversion.

Pittsburgh recaptured the lead with a 3-yard touchdown run by **RB Fitzgerald Toussaint** followed by a Steelers' successful two-point conversion attempt.

On the ensuing drive, Steelers **CB Cameron Sutton** picked off Sudfeld to give Pittsburgh a short field, but an interception by Pittsburgh **QB Joshua Dobbs** allowed Philadelphia to regain control. The Eagles capitalized with 63-yard touchdown pass from Sudfeld to **WR Shelton Gibson**. The extra point attempt failed.

The Steelers bounced back in the final minutes of the half when Dobbs found rookie **WR Damoun Patterson** in the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown.

The Pittsburgh defense held Philadelphia scoreless in the second half, as **K Chris Boswell** kicked three field goals before time expired.

Patterson led all receivers with six catches for 77 yards and a touchdown in the 31-14 win.

After trailing by 14 to start the game, a pair of 2017 Steelers draft picks helped tie things up. **RB James Conner** got the Steelers on the scoreboard with a 26-yard touchdown run.

Pittsburgh recovered the ball immediately after rookie **S Terrell Edmunds** forced and recovered a fumble on the Steelers kickoff, providing a short field for rookie **QB Mason Rudolph** to find **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** in the end zone for a touchdown.

Green Bay responded by racking up 27 unanswered points until the streak was broken by Washington, who caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Dobbs up and over the back of Packers CB Demetri Goodson. The two-point conversion attempt - a rush by Dobbs - was successful.

After another Green Bay score, Steelers rookie, **RB Jaylen Samuels** found the end zone on a 1-yard rush, advancing the score to 48-28 in favor of the Packers.

Dobbs connected with Washington once more in the fourth quarter before time expired with Green Bay leading, 51-34.

**CLEVELAND, Ohio** – The Steelers ended Kickoff Weekend locked in a 21-21 tie with AFC North foes, the Cleveland Browns, at FirstEnergy Stadium. The game marks Pittsburgh's third tie following overtime since 1970.

After a scoreless first quarter, Steelers **RB James Conner**, in his first career start, ignited Pittsburgh's offense with a 4-yard touchdown run.

Browns QB Tyrod Taylor tied things up early in the second half with a touchdown rush for 20 yards, but the Steelers responded with touchdowns on back-to-back drives - first a 22-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** to **WR Antonio Brown**, then a 22-yard touchdown run by Conner.

Halfway through the fourth quarter, a Steelers' fumble recovered by Cleveland, led to Browns RB Carlos Hyde scoring a touchdown off a 1-yard rush. Cleveland tied the game just before the two-minute warning with a 17-yard touchdown reception from Taylor to WR Josh Gordon.

Tied 21-21 with 0:23 remaining in regulation, Steelers **DB Cameron Sutton** intercepted a pass intended for Gordon at the Pittsburgh 8-yard line to force the game into overtime.

In overtime, the Steelers drove down to the Browns 24-yard line to set up a 42-yard field goal attempt, but in the pouring rain, the kick by **K Chris Boswell** sailed wide left.

After another Steelers fumble at the Pittsburgh 38-yard line, the Browns set themselves up for their own field goal attempt from 43 yards out with 0:13 seconds remaining. The kick from Zane Gonzalez was blocked by Steelers **LB T.J. Watt**. Time expired on the following drive.

Watt finished the game with 4.0 sacks, while **DT Cameron Heyward**, **LB Bud Dupree** and **LB Jon Bostic** each collected 1.0. Conner finished the game with 31 rushes for 135 yards and two touchdowns, along with five catches for 57 yards.

**PITTSBURGH, Pa.** – The Steelers were unable to overcome a 21-point deficit in their 42-37 loss to the Kansas City Chiefs at Heinz Field.

Three straight touchdown passes from Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes gave Kansas City a 21-0 lead by the end of the first quarter, but the second quarter belonged to the Steelers as Pittsburgh rattled off three-straight touchdowns of their own to tie the game at 21-21 going into the second half.

The Chiefs pulled ahead again at the start of the second half when Mahomes connected TE Travis Kelce in the end zone for a 25-yard touchdown. In the series that followed, Pittsburgh orchestrated an 11-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in a 1-yard touchdown run by Steelers **RB James Conner**.

With the game tied at 28-28, Kansas City racked up two more scores, giving the Chiefs a 14-point lead early in the fourth quarter.

The Steelers cut that lead by two when **CB Artie Burns** and **S Morgan Burnett** tackled Mahomes in the Chiefs' end zone for a safety.

Just after the two-minute warning, the Steelers put seven more points on the scoreboard when **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found the end zone on a 3-yard rush, but with time winding down, the Pittsburgh was unable to overcome its five-point deficit and fell to the Chiefs 42-37.

**TE Jesse James** produced a single-game career high and led all receivers with 138 receiving yards on five receptions and a touchdown. His 138 receiving yards mark the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career. **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** finished with 13 catches for 121 yard and a touchdown.

**TAMPA BAY, Fla.** – The Steelers earned their first victory of the season with a 30-27 primetime win over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at Raymond James Stadium.

Trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, Pittsburgh got on the scoreboard when Steelers **QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **TE Vance McDonald** who stiff-armed a defender to run it in for a 75-yard touchdown. The Steelers then took a 9-7 lead with a 38-yard field goal by **K Chris Boswell**.

Pittsburgh continued to pull ahead with back-to-back touchdowns. First, Roethlisberger found **WR Antonio Brown** for a 27-yard touchdown pass. Next, **LB Bud Dupree** intercepted Buccaneers QB Ryan Fitzpatrick and returned it 10 yards for his first career pick-six.

After a Tampa Bay field goal, the Steelers found the end zone one last time with a 1-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to **WR Ryan Switzer** with six seconds remaining in the half.

With Pittsburgh leading 30-10 at halftime, the Buccaneers scored on two touchdown passes from Fitzpatrick and a field goal in the second half, narrowing the gap to three points. The Steelers defense was able to keep Tampa Bay out of field goal range on their final possession, which allowed Pittsburgh to hang on for a 30-27 lead win.

Along with Dupree, both **DB Mike Hilton** and rookie **S Terrell Edmunds** picked off Fitzpatrick. Edmunds interception marked the first of his NFL career.
