2018 SCHEDULE NOTES



The Steelers have played three of their four scheduled nationally televised primetime games, winning a Week Three Monday Night Football game at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (30-27) and defeating the Carolina Panthers 52-21 on Thursday Night Football at Heinz Field in Week 10. The team's Week 11 game at Jacksonville, originally slotted for Sunday Night Football, was flexed into a 1 p.m. kickoff on Nov. 18.

Pittsburgh's first home nationally televised primetime game occurred in Week Four, when it hosted the Baltimore Ravens on Sunday Night Football (NBC).

The Steelers' Week 13 game at Heinz Field against the Los Angeles Chargers, originally scheduled for 1 p.m. ET, has been moved to an 8:20 p.m. kick on Sunday Night Football. The following week, Pittsburgh travels to Oakland for a 4:25 p.m. ET tilt at the Raiders, originally scheduled for 8:20 p.m.

The Steelers' bye week took place on Oct. 21 (Week Seven).

STEELERS 2018 DRAFT CLASS

S Terrell Edmunds (6-1, 217)

Rd. 1 28th Overall

Played collegiate football at Virginia Tech where he appeared in 37 games, making 31 starts...he totaled 182 tackles, including 6.5 tackles for losses...Edmunds started all 10 games en route to recording 59 tackles during the 2017 season.

WR James Washington (5-11, 213)

Rd. 2 60th Overall

Set an Oklahoma State University school record with 4,472 career receiving yards, also the second-best receiving yardage total in Big 12 conference history...he became one of two players in school history with three seasons of at least 1,000 receiving yards and three years with at least 10 touchdown catches.

QB Mason Rudolph (6-5, 235)

Rd. 3 76th Overall

Led Oklahoma State University to a 32-9 record as the quarterback to produce the winningest record by a signal caller in school history...he finished his career holding no fewer than 54 school records, including single-season and career marks for passing yards, passing touchdowns and pass efficiency...his 13,618 career passing yards rank him fourth in Big 12 conference history.

OL Chukwuma Okorafor (6-8, 320)

Rd. 3 92nd Overall

At Western Michigan University, started each of his final 39 games... he was a first-team All-American selection following the 2017 campaign by the Football Writers Association of America.

S Marcus Allen (6-2, 215)

Rd. 5 148th Overall

Became the sixth player in Penn State football history to reach the 300-tackle mark in a career...his 321 stops rank fifth in program history... he was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2017, starting 13 games and recording 72 tackles (46 solo).

RB Jaylen Samuels (6-0, 225)

Rd. 5 165th Overall

Established a North Carolina State University school record for receptions in a career, finishing with 202...his 47 total touchdowns place him second in program annals and he finished fourth in touchdown receptions (19) and sixth in touchdown runs (28).

The 2018 Steelers Hall of Honor Induction ceremony took place on Friday, Sept. 28, at Heinz Field. Each inductee received a replica of a solid steel football, which replicates the original that was given to Steelers' founder Arthur J. Rooney Sr. by the United States Steel Corporation and United Steel Workers in 1982 on the occasion of the team's 50th Season.

The Steelers' Hall of Honor, established with its inaugural class of 27 members in 2017, is comprised of former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise's success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933.

The Hall of Honor Selection Committee consists of Steelers President Art Rooney II, Joe Gordon, Bob Labriola, Stan Savran, Andrew Stockey, and Tony Quatrini.

STEELERS NAME FOUR TEAM CAPTAINS

The Steelers selected four players to serve as team captains for the 2018 season, the team announced through a vote of their teammates.

Quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** and center **Maurkice Pouncey** will serve as the offensive captains, defensive tackle **Cameron Heyward** will serve as the defensive captain and kicker **Chris Boswell** will serve as the special teams captain.

Roethlisberger has been selected as an offensive captain for the 10th time in his career (2008, '09, '11, '12, '13, '14, '15, '16, '17 and '18). This marks Heyward's fourth consecutive year as a captain (2015-18), and the second time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 18). Boswell has been named a captain for the first time in his career.

LB T.J. Watt has two 3.0 sack games in 2018 - Kickoff Weekend at Cleveland and Week Five vs. Atlanta - the second and third multi-sack games of his NFL career.

The Steelers' defense totaled 7 sacks (**LB T.J. Watt**: 3.0, **LB Jon Bostic**: 1.0, **LB Bud Dupree**: 1.0 **NT Javon Hargrave** and **DT Cameron Heyward**: 1.0) on Kickoff Weekend - the team's third consecutive regular-season game with at least five quarterback takedowns, dating back to Dec. 25, 2017 at Houston.

RB James Conner became the eighth player in Steelers history (13th occasion) to score at least 10 rushing touchdowns in a season with his 10th of 2018 in Week 10 against Carolina.

11

WR Antonio Brown is tied for the NFL lead with 11 touchdown catches in 2018 - his fourth season of his NFL career with at least 10 scoring grabs - the most in team history.

16-39

The Steelers have held opponents to 16 sacks in 2018 - tied as the third-fewest allowed in the NFL - and recorded 39 sacks in 2018 - the most in the NFL.

28.7

The Steelers rank sixth in the NFL with an average of 28.7 points per game in 2018.

45.7

The Steelers' third-down conversion percentage - 64-of-140 - in 2018, the seventh-best third-down conversion mark in the NFL on the season.

50

HC Mike Tomlin earned his 50th regular-season win against an AFC North Opponent in Week Nine at Baltimore. The Steelers are one of two teams (New England: 54) with at least 50 divisional game wins in the Mike Tomlin era, since 2007.

52

The Steelers set a Heinz Field record for the most points in an NFL game with 52 on Thursday Night Football in Week 10 vs. Carolina.

75.8

Pittsburgh ranks second in the NFL with a 75.8 red zone touchdown scoring efficiency in 2018, converting 25-of-33 red zone drives for touchdowns.

112

TE Vance McDonald set a single-game career high and recorded the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career with 112 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown catch on Monday Night Football in Week Three.

117

The number of games in which **WR Antonio Brown** played to record career catch No. 750, in Week Two vs. Kansas City, setting an NFL record for the fewest games to the milestone (Marvin Harrison: 121).

135

RB James Conner rushed for 135 yards in his first career NFL start in Week One - the first 100-rushing yard game of his career and added two rushing touchdowns and finished with 192 yards from scrimmage.

138

TE Jesse James produced the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career with 138 yards in Week Two vs. Kansas City. His 138 yards are the second-most by a Steelers tight end since 1960 (158, Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991).

158.3

An NFL perfect passer rating which **QB Ben Roethlisberger** recorded for the fourth time in his regular-season career in Week 10 vs. Carolina becoming the first NFL quarterback since 1950 with four such games.

211

The number of regular season games **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has played in, all with Pittsburgh, the third-most games played in team history.

452

QB Ben Roethlisberger passed for 452 yards in Week Two vs. Kansas City - the fifth 450-yard game of his NFL career, breaking a tie with Dan Marino for the most in NFL history.

1,085

The number of scrimmage yards **RB James Conner** accumulated in Games 1-8 of 2018 - the second-most in the first eight games of a season by a Steeler (Le'Veon Bell, 2014: 1,086).

WR Antonio Brown reached the 10,000-receiving yard milestone in the 116th regular-season game of his NFL career in Week One - tying Torry Holt for the second-fewest games in NFL history to the mark.

LB Bud Dupree recorded an interception return for a touchdown in Week Three at Tampa Bay - the team's first pick-six since Dec. 13, 2015 at Cincinnati (William Gay).

San Diego, Calif. – RB Le'Veon Bell took a direct snap and scored on a one-yard run as time expired to lift the Steelers to a 24-20 victory on Monday Night Football.

San Diego scored on its first drive of the game, going 84 yards on five plays. QB Philip Rivers capped off the drive with a 12-yard pass to TE Antonio Gates to give the Chargers a 7-0 lead.

Late in the second quarter, Steelers' **K Chris Boswell** connected on a 47-yard field goal to cut the lead to 7-3 at halftime.

Pittsburgh got a splash play on defense late in the third quarter when CB Antwon Blake picked off Rivers and returned the football 70 yards for a touchdown to give the Steelers a 10-7 lead.

The Chargers tied the game 10-10 on their ensuing drive thanks to a 40-yard field goal by K Josh Lambo. On San Diego's next drive, Rivers connected with Gates again, this time for an 11-yard touchdown to give the Chargers a 17-10 advantage.

On the first play of the Steelers' ensuing drive, QB Mike Vick threw a 72-yard touchdown pass to WR Markus Wheaton to tie the game, 17-17.

Lambo made a 54-yard field goal with 2:56 left in the game. Vick then led the Steelers on a 12-play, 80-yard game-winning drive. On the drive, Vick had a 24-yard run, and he threw a 16-yard pass to TE Heath Miller that put the Steelers at the one-yard line.

This week's game will mark the 30th regular-season meeting between Pittsburgh and San Diego/Los Angeles...the Steelers own a 15-game advantage in the regular-season series against the Chargers (22-7)... Sunday's game will be the 16th time the two teams will meet in Pittsburgh, where the Steelers won each of the first 14 home games of the series... the two teams have met 11 times in the month of December (6-5).

FROM THE STEELERS

- With a win over Los Angeles, the Steelers would improve to 465-288-3 during the regular season since 1970.
- Pittsburgh looks to increase their home game win total to four in 2018 on Sunday, and win their fourth consecutive game at Heinz Field.
- Pittsburgh looks to improve to 27-8 in primetime games at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001.
- The Steelers look to improve to 23-7 all-time against the Chargers in regular-season history and to 15-1 in Pittsburgh in the series.
- The Steelers are seeking their second consecutive win against the Chargers in the regular-season series (Oct. 12, 2015, 24-20, in San Diego).
- Pittsburgh looks to extend its December winning streak to three, dating back to Dec. 25, 2017, at Houston, and move to 19-2 in the team's last 21 games in the month of December, dating back to Dec. 15, 2013, vs. Cincinnati.

PRIMETIME SPECIALIST

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 36 primetime games, including a 30-27 win on Monday Night Football in Week Three at Tampa Bay and a 52-21 win against Carolina on Thursday Night Football in Week 10 of the 2018 season.

Mike Tomlin, the 12th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 38-17 overall record in regular-season primetime games.

He is 13-2 on Monday Night Football, 17-9 on Sunday Night Football and 8-6 on Thursday Night Football.

TOMLIN VS. NFC

During his career, **Mike Tomlin's** regular-season record against the NFC is 32-15, including 19-5 at home.

Including the postseason Tomlin has a .667 winning percentage (33-16) against the NFC during his first 12 years, which ranks first among Steelers' head coaches.

TOMLIN AT HOME

Mike Tomlin has guided the Steelers to a 68-25 career regular-season record at Heinz Field.

Tomlin earned his 50th regular season home win in Week Nine in 2015 vs. Oakland and joined Chuck Noll (119) and Bill Cowher (85) as the third head coach in Steelers history with 50 regular season home victories.

Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first 11 seasons - through 2017 - as the team's head coach and six home wins in eight of his 11 at the helm through 2017.

His 68-25 (.731) record and his 68 home wins is the third best mark and the third most wins in the NFL since 2007:

Mike Tomlin coached the Steelers to a 6-0 sweep of the AFC North in 2017 - the second season since becoming the team's head coach in 2007 that he has earned an unbeaten mark in divisional play (2008 and 2017).

12-PLUS IN

Mike Tomlin produced a career-best 13 wins in 2017 with the Steelers - his fourth season as the team's head coach with at least 12 regular-season wins since becoming the team's head coach in 2007.

Since 2007, Pittsburgh's four seasons with at least 12 regular-season wins are tied with the Denver Broncos for the second-most 12-win seasons in the NFL (New England: 9).

In his first 11 seasons as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

TOMLIN'S 100TH IN 10

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season:

- He is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

QB Ben Roethlisberger connected with **RB James Conner** on a two-point attempt in Week Two vs. Kansas City and in Week Four vs. Baltimore and one with WR JuJu Smith-Schuster in Week Six at Cincinnati in 2018.

Pittsburgh converted two of its four two-point attempts in 2017, and three of its nine tries in 2016, their first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).

The Steelers converted 8-of-11 two-point attempts in 2015 - setting a new NFL record for the most conversions in a season.

CONTROLLING THE NORTH

QB Ben Roethlisberger recorded the 45th game-winning drive of his NFL career (41 regular season / 4 postseason), scoring the go-ahead touchdown on a 1-yard run in the Steelers' 20-16 win at Jacksonville in Week 11.

In Week 10 on Thursday Night Football, Roethlisberger registered the fourth regular-season game of his NFL career with a perfect passer rating of 158.3 on Thursday Night Football, completing 22-of-25 passes for 328 yards with five touchdowns and zero interceptions.

He threw 2,560 passing yards in the first eight games 2018 - the most by a Steelers signal caller through the first eight games of a season.

Roethlisberger earned 117 wins in his first 175 regular-season starts - the second-most by an NFL QB in League history through 175 starts (Tom Brady: 136).

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

He earned his 130th win as a starting quarterback in his 192nd start in Week 10 of 2017 at Indianapolis to mark the third-fewest starts in NFL history to win 130 games (Tom Brady: 168 and Peyton Manning: 189).

FACING THE NFC

In 53 career regular-season games against NFC opponents, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted a 38-16 record, including winning each of his first seven starts against conference members.

On Monday Night Football in Week Three of 2018, Roethlisberger threw for 353 yards on 30-of-38 passing with three touchdowns and one interception for a 120.7 passer rating, leading the Steelers to a 30-27 win, tossed three touchdowns in a 41-17 win vs. Atlanta in Week Five and recorded a perfect passer rating of 158.3 with five touchdown passes in Week 10 vs. Carolina.

Roethlisberger's statistics against the NFC are equally impressive in games at Heinz Field.

In 27 career regular-season games against NFC opponents at home, Roethlisberger has a 22-5 mark while completing 558-of-863 passes (64.7 pct.) for 7,341 yards with 55 touchdowns and 16 interceptions for a passer rating of 104.9.

THE 45 AND 50,000 CLUB

QB Ben Roethlisberger became the eighth quarterback in NFL history - first in team history - to reach 50,000 passing yards in regular-season career games - a feat he accomplished in Week 13 of 2017 at Cincinnati. He reached 50,000 passing yards in his 197th regular-season game to become the fifth quarterback in NFL history to reach the milestone in fewer than 200 games.

Roethlisberger became the first player in Steelers history to register 45,000 career passing yards in Week 10's game vs. Dallas. He was the 11th quarterback in NFL history to reach the mark, the eighth to do so with one team, and the fourth active signal caller with 45,000 passing yards.

BEN GOING OVER 90

QB Ben Roethlisberger threw his fourth career touchdown of 94+ yards in Week 12 at Denver in 2018, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history with four touchdown passes of 94+ yards and the only in NFL history with four touchdown throws of 90+ yards.

His 97-yard connections, (Oct. 29, 2017 at Detroit and Nov. 25, 2018 at Denver) with **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** are the longest passing plays in franchise history and tie as the longest offensive play in franchise record books.

WR Antonio Brown reached the 7,500 scrimmage yard milestone in Week Three's game at Philadelphia in 2016. He accomplished the feat in his 89th career regular-season game to tie Calvin Johnson for the fourth-fewest games to 7,500 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

Brown reached the 8,000 scrimmage yard mark in Week 10's game vs. Dallas in 2016, in his 95th career regular-season game to mark the sixth-fewest games to 8,000 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

In Week Five vs. Jacksonville, Brown totaled 10 catches for 157 receiving yards to eclipse the 9,000 scrimmage yard barrier. He reached 9,000 career scrimmage yards in 106 regular-season games - marking the third-fewest games to the milestone in Steelers history (Jerome Bettis: 101 and Franco Harris: 104) and tied Randy Moss for the fifth-fewest games to the milestone by a wide receiver in NFL history.

WR JuJu Smith-Schuster has set single-season career highs for receptions (77) and receiving yards (1,055) in 2018, leading the Steelers' offense in both categories. He opened the 2018 season with three consecutive 100-receiving yard games, and added a sixth of the year with a 189-yard performance in Week 12 at Denver.

In Week One, Smith-Schuster finished with a game-high 119 yards on five catches, and hauled in a single-game career best 13 grabs for 121 yards and a touchdown in Week Two vs. Kansas City. In Week Three on Monday Night Football at Tampa Bay, he led all receivers with nine receptions for 116 receiving yards.

Smith-Schuster ended his regular-season rookie year becoming the first rookie in Steelers history to record a kickoff return for a touchdown (96 yards) and a touchdown catch (20 yards) in the same game in Week 17 vs. Cleveland. His 265 combined yards (143 receiving + 122 kickoff return) were the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (273, Charles Johnson, Dec. 24, 1994 at San Diego).

He totaled a single-game career highs in receiving yards (193), including a 97-yard touchdown catch-and-run from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the team's Week Eight 20-15 win at Detroit. The 97-yard connection is the longest pass play in team history and ties as the longest offensive play in franchise annals. His 193 receiving yards marked the second-most by a Steelers rookie in a single-game, behind Jimmy Orr's 205 on Dec. 13, 1958.

In Week 15 vs. New England, the rookie wide receiver posted the second 100-yard game of 2017, leading the team with 114 yards on a team-best six catches. His 69-yard catch-and-run is the second longest reception of his NFL career.

His five touchdown catches are the most in NFL history by a player before his 21st birthday (turned 21 on Nov. 22).

CONNER STRONG



RB James Conner became the first player in team history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10 touchdowns in the team's first eight games of a season in 2018, and scored at least one touchdown in five straight games (Games 5-9).

Conner recorded three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns in three consecutive games, Games 5-7, becoming the first player in Steelers history - and the first NFL player since 2009 (Chris Johnson) to tally three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

Conner rushed for nine touchdowns in the first eight games of 2018, tied as the most by a Steeler through the first eight games of a season (Franco Harris, 1976) and his 1,085 yards from scrimmage are the second-most through eight games of a season in team history (Le'Veon Bell, 2014: 1,086).

Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), touchdowns (2 rushing), receptions (5), receiving yards (57) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland.

His 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-rushing yard game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards are the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.

The second-year running back totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing touchdown and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a one-yard run, in Week Two against Kansas City.

In Week Five vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with two rushing touchdowns. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and two rushing touchdowns in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).

CONNER'S HONORS

RB James Conner earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week (Week Eight) and AFC Offensive Player of the Month (October) honors.

In Week Eight, Conner led all players in multiple categories, including yards from scrimmage (212), rushing yards (146) and rushing touchdowns (2), adding 5 catches for 66 yards in Week Eight's win vs. Cleveland at Heinz Field.

Conner led the AFC in rushing touchdowns (6), yards from scrimmage per game (175.3), rushing yards per game (122.3) and rushes of 10+ yards (13) in the month of October, while rushing for at least 100 yards and two touchdowns in each of his three October games – becoming the first player in Steelers history with a three-game streak of at least 100-rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns and the first NFL player to do so since 2009.

MCDONALD'S CAREER GAMES

TE Vance McDonald, who has recorded single-season career bests in receptions (36) and receiving yards (444) in 2018, set a single-game career high and registered the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL regular season career with 112 receiving yards on four catches in Week Three of 2018 at Tampa Bay on Monday Night Football.

He became the second Steelers tight end since 1960, to record at least 100 receiving yards in the first half of a game (Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991, 118 yards). McDonald scored a touchdown on a 75-yard pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger in the first quarter, matching a career-long reception (75-yard touchdown while with San Francisco) in 2016 (Sept. 18 at Carolina).

In Week Six at Cincinnati, McDonald set a single-game career best with seven catches (6, Nov. 29, 2015 vs. Arizona, while with San Francisco) for 68 yards.

THE OUTLAW JESSE JAMES

TE Jesse James produced a single-game career high and led all receivers with 138 receiving yards on five receptions and a touchdown in Week Two's game against Kansas City. His 138 receiving yards marked the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career, and the second-most by a Steelers tight end since 1960 (158, Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991 vs. Philadelphia).

James hauled in a career-long 51-yard reception from QB Ben Roethlisberger in Week Nine of 2018 at Baltimore.

Through Week 12, James has set a single-season personal best in receiving yards with 379 in 2018.

HEYWARD SACK NOTES



DT Cameron Heyward leads Pittsburgh's defensive line and is tied for fifth among all NFL defensive tackles with 6.0 sacks in 2018. Heyward has recorded at least a half-sack in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12), and recovered a fumble forced by LB T.J. Watt on a sack of Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles on the final play of regulation in the team's 20-16 win in Week 11.

He recorded a career and team-best 12.0 sacks in 2017 - the second-most by a Steeler defensive lineman in a single-season the statistic became official in 1982:

DT Cameron Heyward recorded 1.5 sacks in Week Five of vs. Atlanta and 2.0 in Week 10 against Carolina at Heinz Field.

Since entering the NFL in 2011, Heyward has recorded eight multi-sack games during the regular-season in which the Steelers are 8-0.

HARGRAVE AT THE NOSE

NT Javon Hargrave produced the first multi-sack game of his NFL career, bringing down Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles (minus five and eight yards) twice in the second quarter in Week 11. He extended his single-season career high to 5.5 sacks in 2018 with a split-sack in Week 12 at Denver, (2016 and 2017: 2.0), and his career quarterback takedown total to 9.5.

WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

LB Vince Williams led all players with 12 tackles (4 solo), including a tackle for a loss in Week One of 2018 at Cleveland. His 12 tackles marked the second double-digit tackle game of his NFL career (15, Oct. 2, 2016 vs. Kansas City). In Week Six at Cincinnati, Williams led the Steelers with 7 total tackles (6 solo) and tallied his first sack of the season.

In Week 10 vs. Carolina, Williams totaled 4 tackles (3 solo), including a sack of eight yards of Carolina QB Cam Newton. He picked off Carolina QB Cam Newton in the first quarter, his second career interception, and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown to mark the first pick-six of his NFL career.

Through the first 11 games of the 2018 season, Williams ranks second on the Steelers' defense with 62 total tackles (38 solo), and has added 4.5 sacks and six tackles for losses, nine quarterback hits and an interception returned for a touchdown.

With a 2.0 sack outing at Jacksonville in Week 11, Watt became the first Steelers linebacker with at least 10.0 sacks in a season since 2010 (James Harrison and LaMarr Woodley). Along with 7.0 sacks in his 2017 rookie campaign, Watt is the first Steelers linebacker since 2013-14 (Jason Worilds) to record back-to-back seasons with at least 7.0 sacks.

Watt finished Week One's game in Cleveland with 10 tackles (7 solo), 3.0 sacks (minus 16 yards) and a blocked field goal. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week One outing, becoming the first Steelers linebacker since 2010 (Lawrence Timmons, Week Six) to receive the honor.

Watt posted his second career and second game of 2018 with 3.0 sacks in Week Five vs. Atlanta, the third multi-sack game of his NFL career. He forced a fumble on his third sack of Atlanta QB Matt Ryan, in the fourth quarter, which was recovered by LB L.J. Fort in the Falcons' end zone for a touchdown.

Watt - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - recorded 52 tackles (39 solo), 7.0 sacks, 10 tackles for losses, 12 quarterback hits, eight passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble and blocked a field goal attempt in 15 games played, all starts, in his 2017 rookie season.

Watt's 7.0 sacks topped the 2017 NFL rookie linebacker class - tied for second among all NFL rookies - and are the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (Kendrell Bell, 2001: 9.0):

Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982. He finished Week 1's 21-18 win at Cleveland with 6 tackles (5 solo), 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception.

With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became:

- Third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

50-5-5-1 - ONLY ONE

LB T.J. Watt was the only NFL linebacker to have finished the 2017 regular season with at least 50 tackles (52), 5.0 sacks (7.0), 5 passes defended (8) and one interception (1).

HADEN BREAKING IT UP



CB Joe Haden hauled in his second interception as a Steeler in Week Eight of 2018 against Cleveland at Heinz Field, the 21st interception of his NFL career.

Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend of 2017 at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half – his first sack with the Steelers – third of his NFL career – and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland). In Week Seven vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.

Since entering the NFL in 2010, Haden has recorded 118 passes defended - tied as the most among all NFL defenders:

The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 102-of-111 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 425 tackles (347 solo), 21 interceptions, 118 passes defended, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

DAVIS: LAST MAN OF 'D'

S Sean Davis leads the Steelers' secondary with 54 tackles (41 solo) through Week 12, to go along with three passes defended and a quarterback hit, in his first season at the free safety position.

Davis has recorded at least 8 total tackles in seven career regular-season games, including an 8 tackle (8 solo) outing in the team's 23-16 win at the Baltimore Ravens in Week 9 of 2018.

The third-year defensive back recorded the first double-digit tackle games of his NFL career with 10 vs. New England in Week 15 of 2017, and tallied a career high 12 vs. Baltimore in Week 14 of 2017.

In the 2017 Week 17 regular season finale vs. Cleveland, Davis posted his sole sack of the season, and hauled in his third interception of the year.

HILTON MAKING AN IMPACT

CB Mike Hilton picked off Tampa Bay QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the second quarter of a Week Three Monday Night Football game at Tampa Bay at the Pittsburgh's six-yard line – his first interception of 2018 – and the third of his NFL career. He also recovered a fumble in the second quarter, forced by CB Artie Burns on Tampa Bay WR Chris Godwin, marking the first defensive fumble recovery of his NFL career.

Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defended.

FORT'S GAME

LB L.J. Fort saw extensive action in the team's Week Five 41-17 win over the Atlanta Falcons at Heinz Field, filling the void of **LB Vince Williams** who missed the game due to injury. In Williams' absence, Fort brought down Atlanta QB Matt Ryan for a sack (minus seven yards) on a 3rd-and-six during the Falcons' opening drive, his first sack of 2018, and the third of his NFL career. Later in the game, he recovered a fumble forced by **LB T.J. Watt** on Atlanta QB Matt Ryan in the fourth quarter, in the end zone, for a touchdown. Fort finished the game with six tackles (6 solo) and three quarterback hits to go along with the sack and fumble recovery-touchdown.

Since joining the Steelers in 2015, **K Chris Boswell** is 94-of-108 overall on field goal attempts (87.0%), including 31-of-40 (77.5%) between 40-49 yards.

Boswell has made seven-of-nine field goal attempts in his NFL career from 50 yards or further, including a 50-yard try in Week 10 of 2018 at Heinz Field against Carolina.

His seven field goals made from 50-plus yards are the third-most in Steelers history (Gary Anderson and Jeff Reed: eight).

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. – Pittsburgh snagged a victory over the defending Super Bowl champions in the team's first preseason game of 2018.

The Steelers opened up the scoreboard with a 71-yard touchdown pass from Steelers **QB Landy Jones** to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster**.

Philadelphia pulled ahead by one point after QB Nate Sudfeld found TE Dallas Goedert in the end zone for a 15-yard touchdown, followed by a successful two-point conversion.

Pittsburgh recaptured the lead with a 3-yard touchdown run by **RB Fitzgerald Toussaint** followed by a Steelers' successful two-point conversion attempt.

On the ensuing drive, Steelers **CB Cameron Sutton** picked off Sudfeld to give Pittsburgh a short field, but an interception by Pittsburgh **QB Joshua Dobbs** allowed Philadelphia to regain control. The Eagles capitalized with 63-yard touchdown pass from Sudfeld to **WR Shelton Gibson**. The extra point attempt failed.

The Steelers bounced back in the final minutes of the half when Dobbs found rookie **WR Damoun Patterson** in the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown.

The Pittsburgh defense held Philadelphia scoreless in the second half, as **K Chris Boswell** kicked three field goals before time expired.

Patterson led all receivers with six catches for 77 yards and a touchdown in the 31-14 win.

GREEN BAY, Wis. – Steelers 2018 second-round draft pick **WR James Washington** stood out among rookies in Pittsburgh's 51-34 preseason loss to Green Bay at Lambeau Field.

Washington led all Pittsburgh receivers, catching five passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns from Steelers **QB Josh Dobbs** in the second half.

After trailing by 14 to start the game, a pair of 2017 Steelers draft picks helped tie things up. **RB James Conner** got the Steelers on the scoreboard with a 26-yard touchdown run.

Pittsburgh recovered the ball immediately after rookie **S Terrell Edmunds** forced and recovered a fumble on the Steelers kickoff, providing a short field for rookie **QB Mason Rudolph** to find **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** in the end zone for a touchdown.

Green Bay responded by racking up 27 unanswered points until the streak was broken by Washington, who caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Dobbs up and over the back of Packers CB Demetri Goodson. The two-point conversion attempt - a rush by Dobbs - was successful.

After another Green Bay score, Steelers rookie, **RB Jaylen Samuels** found the end zone on a 1-yard rush, advancing the score to 48-28 in favor of the Packers.

Dobbs connected with Washington once more in the fourth quarter before time expired with Green Bay leading, 51-34.

CLEVELAND, Ohio – The Steelers ended Kickoff Weekend locked in a 21-21 tie with AFC North foes, the Cleveland Browns, at FirstEnergy Stadium. The game marks Pittsburgh's third tie following overtime since 1970.

After a scoreless first quarter, Steelers RB James Conner, in his first career start, ignited Pittsburgh's offense with a 4-yard touchdown run.

Browns QB Tyrod Taylor tied things up early in the second half with a touchdown rush for 20 yards, but the Steelers responded with touchdowns on back-to-back drives - first a 22-yard touchdown pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger to WR Antonio Brown, then a 22-yard touchdown run by Conner.

Halfway through the fourth quarter, a Steelers' fumble recovered by Cleveland, led to Browns RB Carlos Hyde scoring a touchdown off a 1-yard rush. Cleveland tied the game just before the two-minute warning with a 17-yard touchdown reception from Taylor to WR Josh Gordon.

Tied 21-21 with 0:23 remaining in regulation, Steelers DB Cameron Sutton intercepted a pass intended for Gordon at the Pittsburgh 8-yard line to force the game into overtime.

In overtime, the Steelers drove down to the Browns 24-yard line to set up a 42-yard field goal attempt, but in the pouring rain, the kick by K Chris Boswell sailed wide left.

After another Steelers fumble at the Pittsburgh 38-yard line, the Browns set themselves up for their own field goal attempt from 43 yards out with 0:13 seconds remaining. The kick from Zane Gonzalez was blocked by Steelers LB T.J. Watt. Time expired on the following drive.

Watt finished the game with 4.0 sacks, while DT Cameron Heyward, LB Bud Dupree and LB Jon Bostic each collected 1.0. Conner finished the game with 31 rushes for 135 yards and two touchdowns, along with five catches for 57 yards.

KANSAS CITY 42, PITTSBURGH 37

HEINZ FIELD (63,956)

PITTSBURGH, Pa. – The Steelers were unable to overcome a 21-point deficit in their 42-37 loss to the Kansas City Chiefs at Heinz Field.

Three straight touchdown passes from Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes gave Kansas City a 21-0 lead by the end of the first quarter, but the second quarter belonged to the Steelers as Pittsburgh rattled off three-straight touchdowns of their own to tie the game at 21-21 going into the second half.

The Chiefs pulled ahead again at the start of the second half when Mahomes connected TE Travis Kelce in the end zone for a 25-yard touchdown. In the series that followed, Pittsburgh orchestrated an 11-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in a 1-yard touchdown run by Steelers RB James Conner.

With the game tied at 28-28, Kansas City racked up two more scores, giving the Chiefs a 14-point lead early in the fourth quarter.

The Steelers cut that lead by two when CB Artie Burns and S Morgan Burnett tackled Mahomes in the Chiefs' end zone for a safety.

Just after the two-minute warning, the Steelers put seven more points on the scoreboard when QB Ben Roethlisberger found the end zone on a 3-yard rush, but with time winding down, the Pittsburgh was unable to overcome its five-point deficit and fell to the Chiefs 42-37.

TE Jesse James produced a single-game career high and led all receivers with 138 receiving yards on five receptions and a touchdown. His 138 receiving yards mark the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career. WR JuJu Smith-Schuster finished with 13 catches for 121 yard and a touchdown.

TAMPA BAY, Fla. – The Steelers earned their first victory of the season with a 30-27 primetime win over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at Raymond James Stadium.

Trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, Pittsburgh got on the scoreboard when Steelers **QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **TE Vance McDonald** who stiff-armed a defender to run it in for a 75-yard touchdown. The Steelers then took a 9-7 lead with a 38-yard field goal by **K Chris Boswell**.

Pittsburgh continued to pull ahead with back-to-back touchdowns. First, Roethlisberger found **WR Antonio Brown** for a 27-yard touchdown pass. Next, **LB Bud Dupree** intercepted Buccaneers QB Ryan Fitzpatrick and returned it 10 yards for his first career pick-six.

After a Tampa Bay field goal, the Steelers found the end zone one last time with a 1-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to **WR Ryan Switzer** with six seconds remaining in the half.

With Pittsburgh leading 30-10 at halftime, the Buccaneers scored on two touchdown passes from Fitzpatrick and a field goal in the second half, narrowing the gap to three points. The Steelers defense was able to keep Tampa Bay out of field goal range on their final possession, which allowed Pittsburgh to hang on for a 30-27 lead win.

Along with Dupree, both **DB Mike Hilton** and rookie **S Terrell Edmunds** picked off Fitzpatrick. Edmunds interception marked the first of his NFL career.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. – The Steelers earned their 100th regular season victory at Heinz Field with a 41-17 win over the Atlanta Falcons.

Pittsburgh got off to a quick start with back-to-back touchdowns from a pair of 2017 draft picks. First, **RB James Conner** dove into the endzone on a 1-yard touchdown run. On the next Steelers drive, **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** caught an 18-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger**.

Atlanta responded with 10-straight points to narrow the margin to 13-10 in favor of Pittsburgh going into halftime.

The Steelers were first to strike in the second half, as Roethlisberger found **WR Antonio Brown** in the end zone with a 9-yard touchdown pass. Pittsburgh's defense forced the Falcons to go three-and-out on the following drive. Atlanta P Matt Bosher's punt was blocked by Pittsburgh **FB Roosevelt Nix**, giving the Steelers a short field. They capitalized with a 2-yard touchdown run by Conner, his second score of the day.

The Falcons rallied with a 2-yard touchdown run to start the fourth quarter, but a 47-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to Brown gave Pittsburgh a 34-17 advantage.

Pittsburgh scored its final touchdown of the day when **LB T.J. Watt** sacked and stripped Falcons QB Matt Ryan for an 8-yard loss, and the ball was recovered by Steelers **LB L.J. Fort** in the end zone for a touchdown, sealing a 41-17 win.

CINCINNATI, Ohio – A 31-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** to **WR Antonio Brown** in the final 10 seconds of regulation sealed the Steelers first divisional win of the season by a score of 28-21.

The Bengals drew first blood in the game with a 2-yard touchdown QB Andy Dalton to WR Tyler Boyd.

Pittsburgh gained momentum in the second quarter with back-to-back touchdown runs from **RB James Conner**, but a 47-yard kick return helped the Bengals tie things up going into halftime.

The next three scores were by Pittsburgh - a 12-yard touchdown run by **RB James Conner**, followed by a 42-yard field goal from **K Chris Boswell**, followed a second touchdown run from Conner right before the two-minute warning.

Trailing 33-12, the Browns were able to find the end zone one last time when Mayfield connected with TE Seth DeValve for a 24-yard touchdown in the final six seconds of the game, solidifying a 33-18 win for Pittsburgh.

Conner recorded a career-best 212 yards from scrimmage (146 rushing / 66 receiving) and added two rushing touchdowns for the third-straight week. Brown led all receivers with 74 yards on six catches.

BALTIMORE, Md. – The Steelers captured their third consecutive division win and fourth-straight overall win with a 23-16 victory over the Baltimore Ravens at M&T Bank Stadium.

In the first half, the Pittsburgh defense held the Ravens to only two field goals, while offensively, the Steelers orchestrated two scoring drives culminating in touchdown passes from **QB Ben Roethlisberger**, first to **RB James Conner**, then to **WR Antonio Brown**.

Leading 14-6, the Steelers were first to strike in the second half with a 1-yard run by Roethlisberger. The Ravens scored their first touchdown of the day with just under three minutes remaining in the third quarter, trimming the lead to 20-13.

Pittsburgh **K Chris Boswell** padded the Steelers' lead in the third quarter with a 29-yard field goal, but with just over five minutes remaining, the Ravens notched a field goal of their own. With a seven-point lead, the Steelers defense stifled the Ravens final drive for the win.

With 163 scrimmage yards (107 rushing, 56 receiving) and a touchdown catch, Conner became the first player in NFL history to record four games within a single season of 100+ rushing yards, 50+ receiving yards and a touchdown.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. – Steelers QB **Ben Roethlisberger** registered a perfect 158.3 passer rating in Pittsburgh's 52-21 win over the Carolina Panthers at Heinz Field on Thursday Night Football.

Roethlisberger completed 22-of-25 passes for 328 yards, five touchdowns and no interceptions in the primetime contest. Each of his five touchdown passes were thrown to a different receiver.

After falling behind 7-0 on the opening drive, Roethlisberger completed his first pass of the game to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** for a 75-yard touchdown, marking the longest first play from scrimmage by the Steelers in team history. Thirteen seconds later, on the Panthers' ensuing drive, **LB Vince Williams** picked off a pass by Carolina QB Cam Newton and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown to take the lead for Pittsburgh. The Steelers added seven more points in the first quarter with a 2-yard touchdown run from **RB James Conner** bringing their first quarter total to 21 points - the most in an opening period of a game by the team since Oct. 2, 2016, vs. Kansas City (22 points).

After Panthers RB Christian McCaffrey connected with Cam Newton a 25-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter, the Steelers defense held Carolina to just 14-points until the final five minutes of the game. Meanwhile, Roethlisberger completed touchdown passes to **WR Antonio Brown**, **TE Vance McDonald**, **TE Jesse James** and **RB Jaylen Samuels** before exiting the game in the fourth quarter, en route to a 52-21 win.

The Steelers' defense sacked Newton five times in the game - two of which came from **DT Cameron Heyward**. Pittsburgh **K Chris Boswell** converted his first 50-yard field goal attempt of the season in the second quarter.

BRONCOS STADIUM AT MILE HIGH (76,536)



DENVER, Colo. – Despite 462 passing yards from Steelers QB **Ben Roethlisberger**, Pittsburgh fell to the Denver at Broncos Stadium at Mile High, 24-17.

The Broncos were first on the scoreboard with a field goal after blocking a 48-yard attempt by Steelers **K Chris Boswell** on the previous drive.

A successful 41-yard kick from Boswell tied the game at 3-3 early in the second quarter, but Denver re-gained the lead on the following drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass from QB Case Keenum to TE Matt LaCosse.

Before halftime, Pittsburgh orchestrated a 12-play 75-yard drive that culminated in a fake field goal attempt in which Boswell threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to **OT Alejandro Villanueva** to tie the game.

The Steelers took the lead early in the third quarter with a 97-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster**, but the game was tied for a third time when a turnover gave the Broncos a short field, setting Keenum up for his second touchdown pass of the day.

Denver took back the lead on the first drive of the fourth quarter with a 2-yard touchdown run from RB Philip Lindsay. An interception by Roethlisberger in the end zone with 1:07 remaining ended the game in favor of the Broncos.
